- Since 1994, spent 3.7 billion SEK in funding of research of highest international class
- Sustainable asset management since 2005; contributes to Mistras total impact



Examples & lessons learned

3 centres running: Stockholm Resilience Centre, Mistra Urban Futures, Mistra Sustainable Markets

14 large research programmes running

- Long-term perspective & legacy
- Large funding effort/co-funding
- Stakeholder involvement/co-creation
- Management & organisation
- Common language & vision
- Output \implies outcome \implies impact
- Rather “innovation net” than “innovation chain”
